**Pastor's Letter** 

# Cultivating

The stained-glass window by the entrance to the chapel illustrates Jesus' parable of the Sower and the Seed (Luke 8:1-15). It speaks to the Word of God and how it is received by various people. For some, Satan steals the seed and they reject the Word of God outright. For others, the Word of God has an initial impact, but when troubles and testing come along, they are quick to fall away. For still others, they hear the Word of God and it grows in their heart. But then the cares and concerns of the world creep up—worries, riches and pleasures—and slowly that seed of faith is strangled off. All three of these are warnings to God's people. And then there is the fourth group, that which falls on the good soil. This is those who hear the Word of God, believe it, By Pastor Ben Golisch

and put it into practice. They remain faithful and produce a harvest of righteousness.

Back in November, we considered this in connection with the scattering of the seed. This month, I'd like to consider it in connection with cultivation. Cultivation has to do with preparing the ground for planting, growing and harvesting. Spiritually speaking, it's loosening the dirt on the hard path, watering the rocky soil (or removing the rocks altogether), and pulling up the weeds of the thorny soil. I know that's not the point of Jesus' parable, but it does speak to things we can do—not to make people believe; that's God the Holy Spirit's work—but things we can do to get ready the soil.

#### Pastor's Letter (Continued)

From an evangelism perspective, once we make contact with a person, how do we follow up? Is this all on the pastor, or do others have gifts like an outgoing personality or a faith which they wear on their sleeve? Are there special events to invite people to come back for? Is there some activity where fellowship can be established or further developed? Is there a way to let people know that we care about them, especially after they have visited once or twice, or a dozen times?

The rub against cultivating is that it can be tedious work. Who likes to pull weeds? Who likes to pick rocks? Who likes to hoe the soil? But consider how important each of these stages are. Without loosening the soil, how can the seed take root? Without removing the rocks, equipment can break down and there's little nutrition for the soil. Without the removal of weeds, the seed cannot get the full nutrients it needs to produce the appropriate harvest.

So, what weeds need to be pulled in our garden? What cares and concerns are pulling nutrients from Christ's work of making disciples? What soil needs to be loosened with kindness and compassion? What obstacles must be removed for people to come and listen? What barriers need to be removed to enable people to come back for more? And how can I help?

There is something else worth noting in the parable. The issue is never with the seed. The



problem is not God's Word. Sometimes people are tempted to think that there is something wrong with the message. Granted, God's Word is proclaimed in clay jars (2 Corinthians 4:7). We are all fallible in our own ways. But that only underscores the power of God and his Word. For it is the Gospel which is the power of God which brings salvation to all who believe (Romans 1:16).

As a congregation, it is important to bring people into the church. It is just as important to build relationships with those who visit. Let them know you care. Talk to them. Invite them back and acknowledge their presence. It will go a long way toward building that bridge of friendship evangelism.

This month we conclude our Lenten journey to the cross and empty tomb. Our midweek theme is **God on Trial**. God is put on trial every day by people all over the world. The great irony is that it is Jesus Christ who will judge the living and the dead. This series takes us back to the moments when God was literally on trial before men in the person of Christ. In these inspired episodes, we find forgiveness for us and all people, love for our enemies, strength for our faith, and courage to testify to the truth.



Wednesday services are 4:00 & 6:30pm with dinner in between services. Maundy Thursday is also 4:00 & 6:30pm, but without dinner. Good Friday services are 1:30 & 6:30pm, also no dinner. (This does NOT impact the Thursday evening service.) In February, we started a new series called *A Tale of Two Synods* taught by Dr. Mark Braun of WLC, based on his book of the same name. The WELS can look back on the 1961 split with The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod as a defining moment for its little, conservative church body. Since then, the WELS has assumed a new profile and distinction in the history of conservative American Lutheranism. This study will look at the history of our relationship with the Missouri Synod, the gathering storm, how fellowship became *the* issue, a sterner kind of love and admonition, and the fallout from this. Finally, Dr. Braun will share what has happened since 1961, which could become a second book for him.

Later in the month, Vicar Meier will again lead us in a study of selected Psalms.

The Wednesday class has concluded. In January, we started a new **Bible Basics** Class which meets Saturday mornings. Watch for weekly notices for what lesson is being taught.


# Door Offering: Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS)

Just like I anticipated, he assured the safety of anyone traveling with them and underscored that it is even safer right now because everyone is on high alert. Things are getting back to normal in most parts of Israel. The tour is nowhere near Gaza, but there are restrictions near Lebanon. Our safety is their highest concern. # Sunday School News: (Submitted by Sue Kohl)

It is time to start making plans for the Sunday School Lenten Dinner Event. The Sunday School will be preparing for the Lenten Dinner on Wednesday, March 6th, at 5:00 pm. We will be asking families to bring a dish to pass, to help serve the meal, and to help clean up.

Each family will receive a sign-up sheet (Perfect Potluck) by e-mail before the event. If there are any questions, please contact Corrine in the church office.



At a Voters Meeting on February 11, the congregation made two important decisions.

- \$37,419 has been collected for the Stained-glass window project (replacing the discolored plastic exterior panels for the large stained-glass windows on the east and west side of the chapel with 1/4" tempered glass). Therefore, the congregation approved the recent proposal from Associated Crafts & Willet Hauser for a total cost of \$30,472. (Any excess from the project will return to the Wish List fund.) We have been in contact with the company and will be put on their schedule soon. (WL – fully funded)
- Back in September, the congregation voted to replace the roof on the CFC and carport for an amount of no more than \$130,000. A downpayment of approximately \$35,000 was to be made at the signing using Employee Retention Tax Credit funds received over the summer. Additional money was to be raised

through a fall campaign, and whatever balance was not covered was to be secured through a second mortgage through Thrivent. Approximately \$30,000 was collected through that campaign and applied to the project, which was completed in December. The project came in under budget at \$113,650. That left a balance of \$49,050. After evaluating the "hoops" Thrivent was requiring of us for the second mortgage, and given that the rate went up to 7.5% which could run \$35,000 worth of interest over the life of the loan, the Church Council took a closer look at funds and suggested using the final \$2,774.74 from Employee Retention Tax Credit, using the final \$2,672.60 from the fall collection, using \$13,000 from the Capital Improvement Fund, and internally borrowing the final \$30,599.66 from our Reserve Fund. This resolution was approved unanimously. (M - fully)funded through the resolution)

This month, the Church Council will review potential projects for the future and will re-evaluate our wish list and re-prioritize the projects.

- Our monthly loan payment is \$5,454.00.
- Due to the great generosity of our congregational members, who use the red special offering envelopes to apply a monetary gift towards the principal reduction, we have seen a rapid decline in our loan liability.
- December 2023 we received an additional \$1,775.00
- January 2024 we received an additional \$975.00

# Little Learners

#### **Childcare News:**

This month our Bible stories and songs are centered on Jesus' ministry on earth. These stories and songs remind us of his awesome power and love. We've been practicing singing, "L.O.V.E.", "Jesus Wants Me for a Sunbeam", and "This Little Light of Mine".



Sunshine class has been enjoying stories, songs, art, and activities this month that involve healthy hearts and bodies, our feelings, friendship, healthy foods, and Groundhog's day. In art, the Sunshine class enjoyed making tissue paper hearts, painting hearts, making Q-tip skeletons, healthy lunch crafts, and class books about our feelings. We made a heart puzzle using the letters of our name, we did a variety of heart scavenger hunts to match patterns, letters, and numbers. We also charted colored hearts and counted which had more or less. We learned about eating a rainbow of foods, and how water, healthy food, and exercise helps keep us healthy. We created candy heart patterns and sorted colors. In science we did a sink or float activity, we listened to our heartbeat. We are also looking forward to measuring how far we can jump. We used shape rulers to measure our fingers, arms, legs, nose, and ears. We worked on personal space when standing in line and kindness this month. Some favorite gross motor games included a heart scavenger hunt, balance beam, bean bag toss, obstacle courses, and hokey pokey.

Rainbow class has enjoyed making apple heart trees, "I Love you to pieces" craft, "I am stronger than anger" art and decorating Valentine's Day bags. In Math we practiced counting 1-20 and identifying 3D shapes. We read books about kindness and our feelings. We also learned



about the letter Ee, and letter sounds and recognition. We also worked on some sight words. We also practiced color sorting, and scissors cutting practice. Rainbow enjoyed color mixing, candy heart graphing, a heart sink/float, and playing in a Valentine's sensory bin. We played a variety of matching games and Valentine bingo. Some gross motor activities included: relay races, one legged hop tag, balance beam, and practice standing with personal space. Some favorite gym games included: Musical hula hoops, freeze tag, follow the leader, and color run.


#### **Care Committee**


